EISEMANN CENTER LAUNCHES 2025–2026 FAMILY SERIES WITH *TOMÁS AND THE LIBRARY LADY* ON OCTOBER 19, 2025, AT 2:00 P.M.

Richardson, TX – The Eisemann Center for Performing Arts is proud to kick off its 2025–2026 ECP Family Season with *Tomás and the Library Lady*, taking the stage on **Sunday, October 19, 2025, at 2 p.m.**, in the Bank of America Theatre. This bilingual play, adapted by José Cruz González from the book by Pat Mora, and produced by San Antonio’s Magik Theater as part of their Magik On The Road series tells a moving and inspirational story that families can enjoy together.

Based on the real-life experiences of Tomás Rivera, the son of Mexican-American migrant farm workers in Crystal City, Texas, the story follows young Tomás as he discovers a love for reading through the kindness of a librarian. His passion for books leads him on a path to become a writer, educator, and the first Mexican-American Chancellor in the University of California system.

Tomás and the Library Lady celebrates the power of stories, imagination, and cultural pride. Performed in both English and Spanish, the production is accessible to a wide range of audiences and offers a meaningful way for families to connect through shared storytelling.

This performance marks the first family show of the Eisemann Center’s new season and sets the tone for a series filled with engaging, diverse, and educational programming for young audiences and their families.
